On **Wednesday, November 30, 2011**, Howard Zemsky is leading a delegation from WNY to present our region's economic development plan. **You can watch it live via video stream at 11:30 am this Wednesday**. Best wishes to Howard and team.

This presentation is the culmination of several months' worth of work by WNY leaders. The plan is designed to promote economic development throughout the region and was conceptualized by 10 different workgroups including the higher education workgroup. The top applications will be awarded \$40 million to implement their plans. Winners will be announced in mid-December.

The WNY College Connection web site has launched an aggressive web optimization program through Google. The results are significant. From November 2010 to November 2011, the unique visitors and number of hits have tripled from 382 and 33,320 to 1250 and 122,000 respectively. Furthermore, the percentage of visitors clicking on the *College Degree Finder* which links them directly to Consortium institutions is 63%! The web optimization clearly has realized tremendous results. In the future, we will launch another form of optimization called "organic" optimization. This will also increase the web presence of the site. Finally, we will continue to promote the site to school counselors and present to districts as we have to Orchard Park and Niagara Wheatfield.

P-16 Educational Leadership Summit Continues Progress

In what can be defined as an innovative and bold move, the educational leaders including but not limited to K-12 superintendents, curriculum developers, teachers, college presidents, chief academic officers, deans, chairs, professors, Erie I BOCES, the Board of Regents (Chancellor Emeritus Robert Bennett), and the Consortium convened to discuss the alignment or lack thereof along the P-16 continuum. Of the higher education participants, there were 7 presidents, 9 chief academic officers, and 27 other professionals from the academic side of higher education.

The keynote speaker was President Jack Quinn with fellow speakers being Don Ogilvie, Superintendent of Erie 1 BOCES; Chancellor Emeritus Robert Bennett; Chris Holoman, chair of the chief academic officers group; and Steve Harvey, executive director of the Consortium. Katie Friedman of the UB Regional Institute successfully managed a lively conversation and collected critical data for moving forward. Since the Summit, a steering committee has been convened and is working on a plan for moving forward through enhanced K-12 & higher education partnerships along two lines: NYS Common Core Learning Standards & Teacher Preparation Programs.

College Law Enforcement Administrators Consortium Launched!

The *College Law Enforcement Administrators Consortium* officially launched its collaboration on October 18, 2011. The CLEAC boasts over 50 members from the 21 participating institutions as well as representatives from the FBI, NYS Troopers, Buffalo Police, Amherst Police, Cheektowaga Police, and a number of other police departments. The CLEAC has already initiated a discussion on a Crisis Management Plan and Memorandum of Understanding that will define how member institutions will provide mutual aid in the event of a natural disaster or other emergency.
