### Say Yes Comes to Buffalo!

In December 2011, the *Say Yes Foundation* announced that Buffalo would be the next Say Yes city in the nation. This opportunity brings with it the promise of a scholarship to *Buffalo Public Schools* students who graduate from high school. The announcement included over \$15,000,000 in funds raised by private and business donations as well as a \$15,000,000 investment by the Say Yes Foundation. Spearheading the Buffalo initiative is the *John R. Oishei Foundation* and the *Community Foundation for Greater Buffalo*. The WNY Consortium of Higher Education signed a letter of support for Buffalo's application and will work with Say Yes to develop the role our institutions will play as the city implements the initiative.

# P-16 Educational Leadership Initiative Focuses on the Future

The P-16 Educational Leadership initiative is expanding the representation of higher education and K-12 leadership. The next planning meeting is March 22, 2012 and will include an additional 30+ higher education representatives including chief academic officers, deans of schools of education, and faculty. Likewise, additional superintendents, curriculum developers, and teachers will be asked to participate. In the future, employers will also be included in the initiative. The goal of the group is to develop a vision and specific goals for the three task forces.

- Common Core Learning Standards
- Teacher Education Programs
- K-12 & Higher Education Partnerships

This initiative will partner with Say Yes and ultimately seeks to fix the "leaks" along the P-16 pipeline. This is critical to the Consortium in order to increase the number of students ready for college and to fill the expected 16% decline in traditional age college students.
