Consortium and Partners Ready to Host 2nd Educational Leadership Summit!

Don Ogilvie, District Superintendent from Erie 1 BOCES said it best when he commented on this effort, "The right people are leading and contributing to this effort. The appropriate priorities have been set. There is systemic sharing of information. True teams have been nurtured. In my experience this is as hopeful set of conditions as it is unprecedented." This position was communicated after the first Summit and a year's worth of planning. On April 10th, the P-16 Consortium will host its second *Educational Leadership Summit* which will include college presidents, chief academic officers, English/writing faculty, deans of schools of education, teacher education faculty, K-12 superintendents, curriculum directors, teachers, NYS assembly and senator representatives, Board of Regents representatives, and the Commissioner of Education, Dr. John King as our keynote. The first half of the Summit will review our accomplishments and goals to date and the second half will be a working session. In addition, we have also invited business leaders, the WNY delegation, our regional representatives on the Board of Regents: Eunice Lewin and Ange Fatta, and foundation representatives from the John R. WNY Student 2 Biz Challenge Set for Regional Competition

The WNY Student 2 Biz Challenge is a student entrepreneurship initiative with the goal of providing highly engaging learning opportunities and identifying and incubating high potential student businesses. This year, we will host a regional competition where over 40+ student pitches will be delivered and the top twelve will earn a trip to the statewide competition in Albany. After the competition, individual campuses will be encouraged to identify those student businesses with the greatest potential and provide them with 1 year of incubation. An Entrepreneurship Inter-Institutional Group will facilitate this annual, year-long program. This year we have 11 Consortium institutions participating and we are looking for close to full participation next year!

The first Buffalo Say Yes Scholars will be on our campuses this Fall 2013 and we are working closely with Say Yes to ensure the best chances for their success. Currently we are developing a retention strategy specifically for Say Yes Scholars and working with the organization to create print materials and web content. In addition, Steve Harvey, executive director of the Consortium has been added to the Leadership Council where decisions around operations, evaluation, and program are made. Finally, we are co-branding Say Yes and the WNY College Connection web site to the Buffalo Public Schools. Hope Supernault, our Consortium intern is working on the retention strategy and may reach out to institutions regarding your retention strategies. A final recommendation will come from Hope in late spring.

of the Advanced Manufacturing sector. First, we are convening a group of association leaders who are involved in advanced manufacturing that we will call the WNY Advanced Manufacturing Council. They will be charged with increasing collaboration, leveraging expertise, and decreasing duplication of effort. The second effort is the inclusion of the business community in the P-16 Consortium, where their participation will provide strategic perspective on the role education plays in our evolving job market. Finally, we will be actively engaged in the efforts of the Empire State Development and Buffalo Billion efforts, sitting on one of their implementation teams. This final effort will occur sometime in the future and will serve to link the Consortium to the work being conducted on behalf of efforts like the Buffalo Billion, Dream it!
